SUBJECT: Misconduct by Civilians

#### 1. REFERENCES:

2. **PURPOSE:** To outline policy for addressing civilian and family member misconduct.

3. **SCOPE:** This policy applies to all civilians and family members within the 417th Base Support Battalion (BSB) Area of Operations (AOR).

#### 4. POLICY:


a. We all have the responsibility to create a safe, healthy, and nurturing community in which we reside. It is the responsibility of sponsors and parents to prevent misconduct by their family members. As the Civilian Misconduct Action Authority, I will take action on all civilians and family members, living within the 417<sup>th</sup> BSB AOR, for incidents of misconduct. Misconduct includes criminal offenses and conduct prejudicial to good order and discipline within our community.

b. Actions that I will take for cases of civilian misconduct include minor administrative actions such as oral reprimands and letters of warning or adverse administrative actions such as suspension/revocation of logistical support (PX or commissary privileges, housing, loss of driver's license, etc.), Early Return of Dependents, and bars from installations. I will take one or more of these actions against an offender based on the severity of the offense, the offender's prior record, and the age and maturity of the offender.

c. I may give offenders the opportunity to prove that they wish to remain responsible members of the community through a community supervision program. A community supervision program may include performing voluntary community service, periodically reporting in person or receiving periodic home visits from a community supervision officer, remaining at home during specified hours of the day, attending courses and/or counseling, and making payments to or perform services for victims affected by the misconduct to reimburse the victims for damage or loss. Failure to successfully complete a community supervision program will result in an adverse administrative action.

d. I view serious criminal offenders and multiple offenders who have failed to prove that they are responsible members of the community as a threat to the health and safety of our community, and I will take immediate action to remove those offenders from our community permanently, and may refer charges to German or US Federal Court.
