SUBJECT: Policy Letter 10, Reenlistment Incentive



2. The United States Army wants to keep high quality soldiers in its organization. However, they have high standards of performance and must, above all else, maintain a combat ready force at all times. In order to maintain a highly motivated "ALL VOLUNTEER ARMY", each officer and NCO within this Detachment should know the basic reenlistment options and those incentives afforded by our Detachment and this Battalion to soldiers who reenlist.

3. Supervisors must take the time to check on each of their soldiers' eligibility status and DEROS, and ensure that the right soldiers stay in the army. It is the supervisors' responsibility to recommend their soldiers for reenlistment. You know your soldiers better than I do because you see them more than I do. Therefore, supervisors must inform the Commander of those soldiers who are in their eligibility window and have good standing in the military. Supervisors will present reenlistment papers to the Detachment Commander for confirmation.

4. If you're a member of this detachment," then you will have the opportunity of choosing the location of where you would like to reenlist, as long as it is within a reasonable driving distance. Soldiers who reenlist will have the remainder of that day off and will be awarded a 4-day pass to be used within 60 days of the reenlistment. Soldiers who reenlist to stay in this organization, the 417th BSB, will be awarded one 4-day pass and one 3-day pass to be used within 90 days of reenlistment.
