HALLOWEEN SAFETY

HALLOWEEN is coming soon. Here are some safety tips for your children, for a "Safe and funny HALLOWEEN"

1. Make-up is much safer for your child than a mask, which can obscure the vision.
2. Light, easy to see clothes or costumes should be worn by your child.
3. Let your child wear clothes with reflective strips, patches or paint, which will increase the visibility after dark.
4. A flashlight or battery powered lantern will make your child better visible and let the child see where he/she is going.
5. "Everyday" shoes are much safer and more comfortable for your child than high heels or poorly fitting "costume" shoes.
6. If your child is wearing a wig, it should be non-flammable material.
7. The bag – for collecting treats – should be small enough for your child, so it won't block his/her vision or cause tripping. A handle will make it more manageable and convenient too.

TIPS FOR YOUR CHILDRENS' SAFETY

Make-up is much safer than a mask, which can obscure vision

Wigs (if used) should be non-flammable.

Flashlight or battery powered lantern to make a child visible and let the child see where he/she's going.

Reflective strips, patches or paint increase visibility after dark.

Shoes - Everyday shoes are much safer and comfortable than higher heels or poorly fitting "costume" shoes.

Bag - for collecting treats - small enough so it won't block vision or cause tripping. A handle makes it more manageable and convenient too.

Light, easy to see clothes or costumes.
